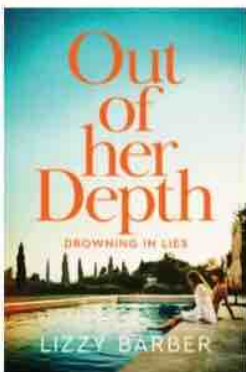
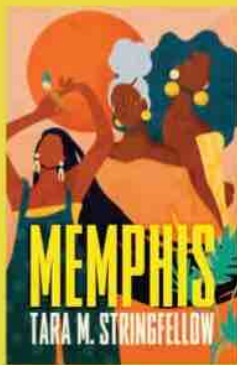

## My book of the month

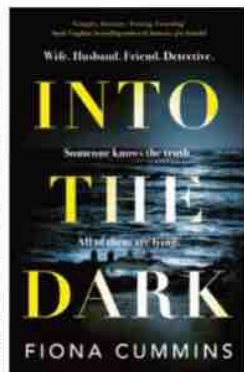
*Memphis* by Tara M Stringfellow
